

Minutes
Council Meeting
August 12, 2008

- I. A regular scheduled meeting of the Borough Council was called to order at 7:03 p.m. by President Edward Mitchell. The meeting was held in the Upland Municipal Building.
- A. Present were: President Edward Mitchell, Vice President Christine Peterson, Council members Mrs. Sandy Miazza, Ms. Moira Crawford, Mrs. Georgianna Hicks, Mr. Lee Hunter and Mr. Dennis Walls. Mayor Michael Ciach, Mr. Charles Catania, Sr. P.E., Mr. Robert O'Connor, Esquire, and Mrs. Shirley Purcival, Borough Manager Treasurer/Secretary were present.
- B. Approximately ten residents attended the meeting and Fire Chief Dan Smith.
- II. The Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag was lead by President Edward Mitchell. The Pledge was followed by a moment of silence.
- III. Moment of Silence
- V. President Edward Mitchell asked for a motion to accept the Minutes of the Council Meeting of July 8, 2008.

Mr. Walls offered a motion to accept the Minutes of Council Meeting of July 8, 2008, which is seconded by Mrs. Miazza.

Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

VI. Treasurer/Manager's Report - Mrs. Shirley Purcival

Mrs. Miazza made a motion to accept the Treasurer/Manager's Report, Items A-1 through A-2. Mrs. Hicks seconded the motion.

Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

VI. A-1 a) Income Statements:

Mrs. Peterson offered a motion to accept the Income Statements, which is seconded by Mr. Hunter.

Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

VI. A-2 Manager's Report:

President Mitchell asks Mrs. Purcival, Borough Manager if there is anything additional.

Mrs. Purcival responds there is a request from the Lighthouse Church for a \$250.00 donation.

Mrs. Miazza requests the amount be lowered to a \$150.00 donation.

Mrs. Miazza offered a motion to accept a \$150.00 donation to Lighthouse Church, which is seconded by Mr. Walls.

Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

VII. Auburn Village Report - Mr. Dennis Walls

Mr. Walls stated the Auburn Village Committee discussed the cutting down of two trees. The Highway Department completed the job and have a letter of commendation in their personnel file for a job well done.

Mr. Walls offered a motion to spend \$925.00 for a fenced in area of the electrical box in the vicinity of 512 Willow Way. The purpose is due to the fact that a lot of young people hang around that area despite the No Loitering Signs and High Voltage.

President Mitchell asks Mrs. Purcival, Borough Manager if there is money in the budget for that.

Mrs. Purcival responds that it will come out of the Auburn Village Account.

Mrs. Miazza seconded the motion.

Vice President, Christine Peterson questioned the amount to be spent on a small fence.

President Mitchell reminded Mrs. Peterson a motion was made and seconded.

Mrs. Purcival, Borough Manager stated the fence company is going to be putting in three extra line posts for security and are using the heavy galvanized metal.

Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

VIII. Public Safety - Mr. Leland Hunter

Mr. Hunter offered a motion to accept the Fire Marshall's Report, which was seconded by Mrs. Miazza.

Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

A.2 Fire Chief Dan Smith stated there were 0 Fire Incidents, 12 Non-Fire Incidents, 26 Mutual Aid for a total incidents of 38. There were 2 drills for a total activity of 40, which is up a lot from last year. We had 2 civilian injuries, 19 assists, 3 cover up, 4 rapid intervention calls, 1 motor vehicle accident, 1 ambulance assist, 2 electric lines down, 4 fire alarms, 2 good intent and 1 assist to the police.

Vice President, Christine Peterson asks Dan Smith for information regarding their air packs.

Dan Smith responds we applied for a grant and didn't get it. The next year they applied again to just get them updated. We did get that and that was five years ago. Dan Smith will get the information to Mrs. Peterson.

President Edward Mitchell asks Dan Smith how the recruitment is going?

Dan Smith responds it is actually going pretty steady. I think the average runner this month will be within ten, so it is going up.

Dan Smith advised the Inquirer reported that a couple of bills have been passed by the Senate for volunteers in the fire services, one is covered under the Municipality Tax giving credit to active volunteer fire fighters along with tax credits through the government. The government is trying to help us and talking with the other Chief's, we're staying strong.

XI. Building and Grounds Report - Mrs. Sandra Miazza

Mrs. Miazza stated there is nothing to report.

X. Finance and Insurance Report - Ms. Moira Crawford

A. 1 Ms. Crawford stated the invoices for approval from the General Fund were in the amount of \$89,140.54. Ms. Crawford offered a motion for approval of payment of these invoices, which is seconded by Mrs. Peterson.

Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

A-2 Ms. Crawford stated the invoices for approval for the Auburn Village were in the amount of \$5,138.42. Ms. Crawford offered a motion for approval of payment of these invoices, which is seconded by Mr. Walls.

Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

A-3 Budget Requests:

Ms. Crawford asks for everybody's wish lists with fixed amounts or estimates for items for the 2009 Budget. Ms. Crawford asks for this information by the end of August, if possible.

XI. Ordinances and Resolutions - Mrs. Georgianna Hicks

Mrs. Hicks offered a motion to accept Resolution's #26 of 2008 through #30 of 2008, which is seconded by Mrs. Miazza.

Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

XII. Research and Development Report - Ms. Moira Crawford

Ms. Crawford announces the borough has a website address. We are going to be www.uplandboro.org We have about 80% of the information into them already. I just received the remainder of the information this evening, so I expect that we'll have everything to them by the end of the week. They are estimating 4 to 6 weeks. It may be less time than that.

Ms. Crawford advises there are emails for each member of council, including the Mayor, the Borough Manager and Chief Easton.

President Edward Mitchell asks the audience how many people have computers?

President Mitchell states that one of the things that Council is trying to do is to make the Borough Government more transparent, where you can look into our ordinances, minutes, our laws, everything we do here and stop the guessing and speak with someone in authority about what you think. If you need to dial up and leave the Chief a nasty email, you can do that. Little by little the website will be strong by the end of the year.

XIII. Streets and Equipment Report - Mrs. Christine Peterson

Vice President, Christine Peterson stated the front end loader was delivered and we are demoed it and it definitely handles salt much better.

Vice President, Christine Peterson stated the sign at 6th and Church stop sign was made larger.

XIV. Community Affairs Report - Mrs. Sandra Miazza

Mrs. Miazza stated on August the 20th we are taking 35 children to the Wilmington Blue Rocks baseball game. They will be given a boxed lunch which will consist of a hotdog, soda and potato chips and there will be fireworks that night and this is free.

Mrs. Miazza stated on September 27th, there will be a spaghetti dinner a MacQueen Hall. Adults will be \$8.00. Children under ten will be \$4.00. Senior citizens will be charged \$6.00.

Mrs. Miazza stated on October 11th, there will be another Flea Market in Bristol Lord Field.

Mrs. Miazza stated on October 25th there will be a Halloween Party at MacQueen Hall for ages up to 13 years old.

Mrs. Miazza stated on November 28th, there will be a holiday tree-lighting ceremony in the Bristol Lord Field and refreshments at MacQueen Hall.

XV. Use and Occupancy Report - Mrs. Shirley Purcival

Borough Manager, Mrs. Purcival stated in the month of June there were seven inspections that received Use and Occupancy Certificates. Five units failed the inspections and no unit received a Temporary. Mrs. Purcival stated a total of \$1,100.00 was deposited into the General fund.

XVI. Mayor's Report

Mayor Michael Ciach stated the following: Total citations issued were 183. There were \$8,753.00 in fines written. \$4,376.00 comes to the Borough. There were 23 parking tickets issued, 8 motor vehicle accidents. Amount of tickets paid : \$330.00 and 15 tickets were sent to DJ. The amount received from the DJ court was \$1,015.08. There were a total of 316 calls and 18 assists. Also, during the month of July we had (1) reported rape, (4) assaults with weapons, (21) thefts and (18) disorderly conducts.

Mayor Michael Ciach read the following message from the Chief of Police, John Easton:

“Congratulations to our new officers who have received their certifications this month. To date, we have seven new officers that are certified. As always, we are here to help. Please call with any questions or concerns.”

Mayor Michael Ciach stated as a comment we have two issues:
New ID badges. Everyone's got their own and the new ones for the youths are completed.
We will be coordinating an effort to get those out to everyone.

Mayor Michael Ciach stated if any Council member is interested in putting an article in the newsletter, it would be circulated in September.

Mayor Michael Ciach stated as a result of the information given at the Executive Session, it is my office's recommendation that we accept the resignation of one of our part-time officers and that we terminate the employment of one of our full-time officers.

President Edward Mitchell asks for a roll call vote on the resignation of the part-time officer.

On roll call vote: Mrs. Hicks, Aye. Mr. Walls, Aye. Ms. Crawford, Aye. Mrs. Miazza, Aye.
Mr. Hunter, Aye. Mr. Mitchell, Aye. Mrs. Peterson, Abstains.

Mrs. Hicks offers a motion to follow through with the termination of the full-time officer, which is seconded by President Edward Mitchell.

On roll call vote: Mrs. Hicks, Aye. Mr. Walls, Aye. Ms. Crawford, Aye. Mrs. Miazza, Aye.
Mr. Hunter, Aye. Mr. Mitchell, Aye. Mrs. Peterson, Abstains.

President Edward Mitchell asks if Dan DiNardo is coming back onto the force.

Mayor Michael Ciach responds he will return on September 1, 2008.

XVII. Solicitor's Report - Mr. Robert O'Connor

Mr. O'Connor stated the following:

1. Wilmington Blue Rocks tickets release form was reviewed and released for the upcoming baseball game on August 20, 2008.
2. Civil Service Commission- advice to Council regarding the applicability of Civil Service Regulations now that the police force is large enough that the civil service rules now apply.

3. Verizon Franchise Agreement has been finalized.

4. The opinion on Mr. Mace's deed began on May 13, 2008. By the end of May, my office went to the Recorder of Deeds Office and pulled copies of deeds relating to Mr. Mace and the surrounding area.

Mr. O'Connor stated sometime after that we learned that Mr. Birch was involved in representing Mr. Mace. On June 16, 2008 we wrote to Mr. Birch and provided him with copies of all of the documents that we received from the Recorder of Deeds Office and basically informed Mr. Birch that it was the Solicitor's Opinion that it did not appear that all of the necessary deeds had been filed and recorded properly with the Delaware County Recorder of Deeds Office.

Mr. O'Connor stated that on July 15, 2008 we again wrote to Mr. Birch and requested that he contact my office to discuss the matter and again, I reiterated, again based on my opinion there did not appear that the deeds were actually recorded in Delaware County. Unfortunately, I have not been able to get an opinion back from Mr. Birch. I called Mr. Birch today and did not get back to Mr. Birch as of the end of this day. This is the best update that I can give. Obviously, we are trying to communicate with Mr. Birch's office and get a response from him to advise us if he is in agreement with the Solicitor's Opinion.

President Edward Mitchell has a few questions:

If we block off the alley do we need to get a release from all of the homeowners?

Mr. O'Connor responds: What do you mean, if we block it off? We would have to work with all of the landowners.

President Edward Mitchell responds:

If their homeowner's insurance let them do that?

Mr. O'Connor's advice to the homeowner's would be that they first check with their insurance carriers to determine whether or not they might regret what they did once they did it.

Mr. O'Connor suggests to Mr. Mace, if you haven't, and it may not be an issue, but obviously if it were me, I would prefer to know before I changed the ownership of my property and that now I can't get homeowner's insurance or my homeowner insurance rates have quadrupled because of the decision I had just made.

Mr. Mace interrupts Mr. O'Connor.

Mr. O'Connor advises Mr. Mace that he will contact Mr. Birch in the morning.

XVIII. Engineer's Report - Mr. Charles Catania, Sr.

Mr. Catania stated we have not heard from the county on the Upland Park CDBG Grant. As soon as we get the notice to proceed, we will advertise that project for bid.

Mr. Catania stated he gave the Council and the Borough Manager the information on the housing repair work for their future consideration.

XIX. Chester Upland School District Report - Mr. Kamp

President Edward Mitchell stated that Mr. Kamp is not present, but in his absence, the agenda which is public record at last month's meeting at the Chester Upland School District, they did pass the budget. The budget is now \$104,152.800 that represents \$25,600.00 per student.

XX. Old Business

Mr. Walls asks President Mitchell if it is necessary for Mr. Catania and Mr. O'Connor to be present during the caucus meeting.

President Mitchell responds: Yes and it was well established back in January when we first came into office, it wasn't a monetary thing. In the old days we used to have a caucus meeting one week and the regular meeting the following week. If there was ever a question that came up in the caucus meeting, we would have a week to get an answer, but now that we have the caucus meeting at 6:00 p.m. We don't have the luxury of having time to not have a solicitor. If we have a question right then and there, the Solicitor can give us an answer. We don't have that week's time. It doesn't cost anymore money because it's in their retainer. It's not a monetary thing. It's a convenience because we can get things done at one time.

Mr. Walls responds that it just seems like wasted time on their part. Time is money for them. I can't see them sitting here because we adjourn our caucus meetings early.

President Mitchell responds that he hears what Mr. Walls is saying and it is well taken, but keep in mind that at 6:40 p.m. we went into Executive Session and we had some personnel issues. Had the Solicitor not been here, you would have had to wait to 7:00 p.m. for him to get here and then make the audience wait while we're in Executive Session. It kind of works three-fold for everybody. We want to be more productive and that's the reason.

President Mitchell asks if the Council members are still in agreement on that?

Council members responded, yes, except for Mr. Walls.

XXI. New Business

A.6 Swiftreach -911

President Mitchell asks Borough Manager, Mrs. Purcival to explain the program.

Mrs. Purcival responds that Council is looking to institute a new procedure, the Swift 911 call. What it will do is that every home here in the borough, if we have information to give you, you'll receive a phone call. Whether you have an answering machine or you actually pick it up or not, so that you'll have a message left for you.

Mrs. Purcival explains as an example if the creek if flooding at the lower end, everyone would receive a message that we are having flooding issues. Also, if we are having a Flea Market in the fall, everyone would receive a message. We are looking forward to having that. It's something new to try for those who don't have computers at home or don't have time to check the Borough's website for Upland, you would receive a quick phone call.

Mrs. Miazza offered a motion to purchase the Swiftreach 911 system in the amount of \$4,495.00, which is seconded by Mr. Mitchell.

Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

XXII. Floor Open to the Public:

Edward Mace - 403 West 22nd Street, Upland, PA.

Mr. Mace submits a signed petition from all of the residents of West 22nd Street that are being affected by the driveway.

Mr. Mace asks why the curfew of 9:00 p.m. is not being enforced.

Mr. Mace asks if the Borough will install signs saying "No Trucks Allowed"?

President Mitchell responds that the residents who own that section of driveway prevents the Borough now from putting up signs on private property. It's not monetary, it's about what's doing what is right. It's in your lawyer's hands. You do have to remember, you do have elected officials that will do your bidding for you. You have an elected committee man in your precinct that will handle that. Have him represent you.

Mr. Mace responds that we are all Upland residents and we come to Council with our problems.

President Mitchell responds that Council can't do anything until your lawyer and our Solicitor advises Council what to do.

President Mitchell responds that if the Borough were to make up five great big signs and that would make you happy, we would do it, but it's not going to do it until we hear from your lawyer, it's just that simple. We're not going to be foolish and go up there and hang signs and have something happen and then we are liable, and God forbid, something would happen. We don't know where the ownership lies right now.

President Mitchell continues: You submit a petition that says 109 West 22nd Street.

Mr. Mace responds that it says the 109 residents who live on West 22nd Street and they are all homeowners. No renters got any say in this matter.

Mr. Mace explains that he had to file criminal charges against the trucking company, but at this time, they are destroying people's properties. We all pay our taxes. We pay for the Police Department wages and all we want is protection. We want these trucks to stay off our property. You've all seen the pictures of the damages caused. You're probably looking at 2 to \$300,000.00 in damages that we'll never get reimbursed for. Who are we going to hold responsible for that? Think about that!

President Mitchell stated that Upland Borough cannot file suit for you, even though you have pictures of the damages, we were not a witness as to who caused the damages. I think you need to have your lawyer and our Solicitor handle this and let them both work out what you need to do to make that whole.

Mr. Mace again asks about the 9:00 p.m. curfew.

Vice President, Christine Peterson explains that every day she has several juvenile release forms on her desk that children have been picked up and released to their parents due to curfew, so curfew issues are being handled, of course, we cannot be everywhere at the same time again, so if you see kids on your corner at 9:05 p.m. and our officers are on another call at 9:05 p.m., curfew is being handled all over the borough.

President Mitchell also responds that you would need a cop twenty-four hours out of the day there and you're saying they are not servicing your calls, and that is not the case. If we have nine or ten curfew complaints a night, the officers are doing their job. We have bicycle patrols out there and we have a lot of effort going into this program to keep the streets safe.

Mr. Mace responds that he understands that, but you also have to understand that all kinds of people are running around West 22nd Street all hours of the night and you never seem to see a police officer. I'm not the only one who notices that.

President Mitchell responds that he is not going to belabor the point. If you listen to what the Mayor's report said, there is an 80% decrease in crime in the activities that are going on in the Police Department since it has been reorganized. You can't say, the police are not there. You can't say that it's not being done. It's just not being done in your neighborhood. It's the entire town.

Council Member, Mr. Hunter states to Mr. Mace that what irks him is you keep saying the kids are doing this, the kids are doing that. A lot of these kids live up that way. Where are their parents to correct this problem? You're in here talking about how bad they are and the parents are at home watching television. The parents are the ones who should be responsible.

President Mitchell addresses Mr. Mace that he has been at this for twenty minutes.

Denise Stone - 1114 West Mowry Street, Chester, PA.

Dawn Lucas - 521 West 24th Street, Upland, PA.

Mrs. Lucas states that she has been a resident for over thirty years and that recently within the past year, she feels as though she is living in Johannesburg, South Africa. The boys can't even walk down the street without a cop stopping and searching them, cursing them out, mf'ers this and mf'ers that. Slamming them on the ground, knee in their back with a gun at their head. These boys are athletes. They don't smoke, they don't drink. Mike just turned 16 a couple of weeks ago. Although at 6 foot, he might not look like he's 16. Rodney just turned 17 a couple of weeks ago. Week after week, I call this cop, Officer Ridley, I don't know his name. Mrs. Lucas continues that she's lived here for thirty years and these new cops, pull me over constantly.

Mrs. Lucas continues that last Wednesday night right by the nursing home, Upland, Chester and Parkside cops were all over. Officer Dave Edwards was the only one who had common sense to come and get me. They searched these kids, threw them to the ground and handcuffed them and this is not the only incident. This is continuous. This is too much. I've lived here for thirty years and my family never had any problems. All of a sudden, I see some new people, but this ain't going to happen to my family. All I know is 24th Street is my house. My boys don't run the streets.

President Mitchell asks Chief Easton if he can meet with the parents. There is a neighborhood issue going on here.

Mrs. Stone explains she was at Upland Borough over a year ago and I talked to Mrs. Purcival in regard to curfew. The rules in Chester and Upland are different. My kids live in Chester. I don't know the Upland rules. So if no one tells me that he can't walk through the Upland Shopping area, then I won't know, but when you slam him on the back of your car and threaten to take him to Juvenile, for what? That was an Upland cop. The one that happened was on Wednesday.

George Patterson - 501 Willow Way

He has seen much improvement in the Police Department and is thrilled about the new police station.

Vice President, Christine Peterson addresses Council to offer a motion to purchase the new front end loader in the amount of \$76,292.00, which is seconded by Mrs. Miazza.

On roll call vote: Mrs. Hicks, Aye. Ms. Crawford, Aye. Mrs. Miazza, Aye. Mr. Hunter, Aye. Mrs. Peterson, Aye. Mr. Mitchell, Aye. Mr. Walls, Nay.

Vice President, Christine Peterson offered a motion to cancel the second meeting of the month, which is seconded by Mrs. Miazza.

Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

FLOOR OPEN TO THE PUBLIC - CONTD.

John Mitchell - Pastor, Lighthouse Church 259 Sixth Street

We sent an informational letter about the Chicken Dinner that you are all invited to. Please let the Fire Department know about it and if there is any help available, we would appreciate it.

Pastor Mitchell stated that they conducted a survey over a year ago of two miles within our Church. It touched Upland, Toby Farms and Brookhaven. He would like to submit this information to Council and go over this information. Pastor Mitchell explains they went through the community and asked people on the street what they thought about the borough, what was their understanding of the history of the borough, what they liked about the borough and what do they think could be done to enhance the borough.

Pastor Mitchell stated their church has an outreach program, after school programs, character education, academic and nutrition education. We also have a skills for life program which basically lets students from middle school to high school about careers. We also ran a pilot at Chester High School and between the junior and senior class we recruited about two hundred students. We are also working with P.I.T. (PA. Institute of Technology), which was an unfunded program. We are actually looking for funding now.

Pastor Mitchell continues that he went to the borough and got the zoning code for the area. I didn't see anything in there because on our property we have that big parcel of land behind the church and we were looking to bring the Community Center there in a safe harbor environment, which is more accessible to the community, to help the community grow and have people enjoy their community.

President Edward Mitchell states that Upland Borough Council is very much willing to work with you to make the community better.

President Mitchell recommends to Pastor Mitchell that any plans are looked at by the Borough Manager and the Borough Engineer, but anything you have, we are more than willing to support your efforts. I know there are a lot of pipelines back there. That is why it is such a wooded area because it couldn't be developed. I'm not saying this to discourage you. I just ask that you be cautious. I'm sure the Borough Manager and Borough Engineer can assist you.

President Mitchell asks for a motion to approve a quarterly reimbursement of \$125.00 for the Code Official's gas allowance.

Vice President, Christine Peterson offered a motion, which is seconded by Mr. Walls to approve the quarterly gas allowance.

On roll call vote: Mrs. Peterson, Aye. Mrs. Miazza, Aye. Mr. Walls, Aye. Mrs. Hicks, Aye. Ms. Crawford, Aye. Mr. Mitchell, Aye. Mr. Hunter, Abstains.

President Mitchell asks the Council if they had a chance to review the Solicitor's Opinion on Clearwater Lane.

Mr. O'Connor, Solicitor states that what was discussed was having the Borough pay for repairs to this particular location on Clearwater Lane.

Mr. O'Connor states that the concern is obviously, if the Borough does that for one person, where do you draw the line and you open up a Pandora's box. You have to have a legal obligation unless you want to take taxpayer dollars to do that.

Mr. O'Connor's advice to Council is they have no legal obligation.

President Mitchell asks the Solicitor what the Upland Borough Council should do. Are we not going to do anything? Is it surchargeable if we did something?

Mr. O'Connor asks President Mitchell, when he says surchargeable do you mean if the Borough pays for it and the Borough tries to collect it.

President Mitchell replies, no. If we did agree to pay for it and then someone else in another part of the Borough and then we denied them.

Mr. O'Connor advises President Mitchell that if the Borough Council agrees to pay for one taxpayer, then you set a precedent. You have to review each incident on a case by case basis, but obviously, if there is a legal obligation, but you have to understand as much as you want to help one taxpayer...

Mrs. Miazza states the information about the Clearwater property should have been disclosed at the time of the settlement of the property that the yard flooded.

Mrs. Miazza asks Mrs. Purcival, Borough Manager if she remembers two or three years ago, all the problems they had on Scott Avenue. How did that ever get resolved?

Mr. Catania, Borough Engineer responded that was a sewer issue and was taken care of by Delcora.

Vice President, Christine Peterson states the Council needs to have a general consensus because I told the property owner of Clearwater Lane that the Borough Manager would get back to him with an answer.

President Mitchell asks the Mr. Catania, the Borough Engineer if it is the Borough's responsibility.

Mr. Catania stated "I think part of the problems are from this homeowner or the prior owner had done things improperly themselves." If there is a problem caused by the predecessors, and this homeowner cut a trench down the one side of his property and of course, as soon as you induce water into the ground it is going to find the path of least resistance and go to the foundation. What this homeowner is afraid of is his house is going to crumble from the water. The Borough didn't create that problem and therefore, the Borough should not take care of this. If the homeowner does things on his property, he ought to make sure he's not causing the problem himself and in this case, opening the trench along that property, did create some of the problems he is having with the foundation."

President Mitchell asks Mr. Catania if the Borough Council should forward a letter to the homeowner of Clearwater Lane notifying him that unfortunately, upon the recommendation of the Solicitor and the Borough Engineer, this is not the Borough's responsibility?

Mr. Catania responds the letter should be the Solicitor's Opinion because you'll be doing a dozen of these problems throughout the borough.

President Mitchell asked that the Borough Manager to forward such letter to the homeowner.
