

Minutes  
Council Meeting  
May 13, 2008

- I. A regular scheduled meeting of the Borough Council was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Edward M. Mitchell. The meeting was held in the Upland Municipal Building.
  - A. Present were: President Edward M. Mitchell and Vice President Christine Peterson. Present were Council members Mrs. Sandy Miazza, Ms. Moira Crawford, Mr. Lee Hunter and Mr. Dennis Walls. Mr. Charles Catania, Sr. P.E., Mr. Robert O'Connor, Esquire, Mrs. Georgianna Hicks, and Mrs. Shirley Purcival, Borough Manager Treasurer/Secretary were present. Mayor Michael Ciach was absent due to a family emergency.
  - B. Approximately seven residents attended the meeting.
- II. The Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag was lead by President Edward M. Mitchell. The Pledge was followed by a moment of silence.

- IV. President Mitchell asked for a motion to accept the minutes of the Council Meeting of April 08, 2008.

Mr. Walls made a motion to accept the minutes of the meeting of April 8, 2008. Mrs. Miazza and Mr. Hunter seconded the motion. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

- V. President Mitchell asked for a motion to accept the Grass Cutting Bid Opening Minutes of May 5, 2008.

Mrs. Hicks made a motion to accept the Grass Cutting Bid Opening Minutes of May 5, 2008. Mrs. Peterson seconded the motion. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

#### VI. Treasurer/Manager's Report - Mrs. Shirley Purcival

Mr. Walls made a motion to accept the Treasurer/Manager's Report. Mr. Hunter seconded the motion. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

Mrs. Miazza made a motion to accept the Income Statements. Mr. Walls seconded the motion. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

Mr. Hunter made a motion to accept the Manager's Report. Mrs. Miazza seconded the motion. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

Mrs. Hicks made a motion to accept the Proof of Publication for the Grass Cutting Services Bid. Mrs. Miazza seconded the motion. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

Mrs. Peterson made a motion for Mr. Catania to draw up specifications and bid out the 2008 Road Program. Mrs. Miazza and Mr. Hunter seconded the motion. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

Mrs. Peterson made a motion to apply for the 2008 County Liquid Fuel Aid in the amount of \$4,050.00. Mr. Walls seconded the motion. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

Mrs. Miazza made a motion for Mr. Catania's request for Change Order #1 for the CDBG Project #07-44a for Municipal Park Improvements in the amount of \$9,600.00 which will provide for the installation of six foot high vinyl-coated protector pads for the sports netting poles.

#### VII. Auburn Village Report - Mr. Dennis Walls

Mr. Walls stated, progress.

#### VIII. Public Safety - Mr. Leland Hunter

Mr. Hunter stated that the Fire Marshall conducted twenty rental property inspections this month. The Business inspections will begin in May. Mr. Hunter stated that during the rental inspections, the Fire Marshall found electrical hazards, fire hazards and plumbing problems.

Mr. Hunter also stated the following Fire Investigations/Reports were filed:  
April 14, 2008 - 15 Scott Avenue handled by the Brookhaven Fire Marshall  
April 16, 2008 - 15 Scott Avenue review of cause and origin with insurance company  
April 16, 2008 - Assisted Upper Chichester Fire Marshall with an apartment fire.

Mr. Hunter stated the Fire Marshall was contacted by Fire Chief Smith on the following issues:  
3436 11<sup>th</sup> Street - Resident illegal burn 26 cars and wrote citation and the Front Street trash fire started by kids.

Mrs. Hicks made a motion to accept the Public Safety Report. Mrs. Miazza seconded the motion. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

XI. Building and Grounds Report - Mrs. Sandra Miazza

Mrs. Miazza stated the bid for Grass Cutting Services is awarded to Kirby Lawn Care as the other bidder did not indicate weed whacking and spraying. Mrs. Hicks made a motion to accept the Grass Cutting Bid Award. Mrs. Peterson seconded the motion. On roll call vote: Mrs. Hicks, Aye. Mr. Walls, Aye. Ms. Crawford, Aye. Mr. Hunter, Aye. Mrs. Peterson, Aye. Mr. Mitchell, Aye. Mrs. Miazza - Abstains.

X. Finance and Insurance Report - Ms. Moira Crawford

Ms. Crawford stated the invoices for approval from the General Fund were in the amount of \$137,004.56. Ms. Crawford offered a motion for approval of payment of these invoices, which is seconded by Mr. Walls. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

Ms. Crawford stated the invoices for approval for the Auburn Village were in the amount of \$6,104.26. Ms. Crawford offered a motion for approval of payment of these invoices, which is seconded by Mrs. Miazza. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

Ms. Crawford stated the Finance and Insurance Committee met with our insurance broker regarding the renewal for August 1<sup>st</sup>, which would include renewals for General Liability, Employee Benefits Liability, Property Insurance including boiler and machinery and inner marine, Public Officials Liability, Employment Practices Liability, Law Enforcement Liability, Automobile and Umbrella Liability.

Ms. Crawford stated it was a very good meeting with Mr. Larkin and Ms. Frederick of Brokerage Professionals. We gave them the approval to go after the following markets for the renewal. We're going with the incumbent, Scottsdale Insurance Company and National Casualty and also Traveler's, Fireman's Fund and Zurich. We also requested they look at all options, deductible levels and also coverage levels. I expect that we will be meeting with them again at the end of June or beginning of July.

Mrs. Hicks made a motion to accept the findings. The motion is seconded by Mrs. Miazza. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

XI. Ordinances and Resolutions - Mrs. Georgianna Hicks

Mrs. Hicks offered a motion to adopt Resolution #16 of 2008 - Enforcement Code Committee. The motion is seconded by Mrs. Peterson. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

Mrs. Hicks offered a motion to advertise for Ordinance #16 of 2008- Verizon Pennsylvania, Inc. The motion is seconded by Mr. Walls. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

## XII. Research and Development Report - Mrs. Georgianna Hicks

Mrs. Hicks stated there are a lot of people working on the website, which is nice, and we have a lot of people who are willing to help out with that very big project. I should be getting information in before June 1<sup>st</sup> and hopefully we can get this started in June. We will get the information into the webmaster and he can tell us how much longer after that.

President Mitchell asks Mrs. Hicks if she needs anything from council.

Mrs. Hicks responded that she already asked everyone on council for certain things. I'm sure there will be a lot of things that need to be tweaked.

## XIII. Streets and Equipment Report - Mrs. Christine Peterson

Mrs. Peterson stated that due to the hard work of our Borough Manager, Mrs. Purcival and our Highway Foreman, Chuck Boyd we received an award for Outstanding Flood Protection Project. Understand that this award is only given to one municipality in Pennsylvania and we got the award!

The audience applauds.

Mrs. Peterson continues, let me just go on to say that in the last five years our Flood Plain Programs have gone from marginal with the DPA and the Corps of Engineers to a triple A rating.

Mrs. Peterson stated that Chuck Boyd attended the annual the annual DEP seminar. We were awarded the top award in the Commonwealth given by the DEP. Again, only one borough and one municipality got the award and he did a wonderful job!

Mrs. Purcival proudly shows the award to Council and the audience.

President Mitchell congratulated and thanked Mrs. Purcival for a job well done. Please let Chuck Boyd know also that we are very pleased and proud.

Mrs. Peterson offered a motion to approve a wage increase for Bob Boyle for an additional dollar per hour. Mr. Boyle has received his CDL license which makes our entire Highway Department CDL certified. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hunter. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

Mrs. Peterson stated the aggressive progress and follow up of the removal of abandoned vehicles. Our officers have gone out and taken photographs and sent notices to the owners. The owners have not removed the vehicles have now been cited. I think we started with maybe thirteen or fourteen and more than half of the owners did remove the abandoned vehicles. We have files and are ready to go to court for those who don't move their vehicles.

#### XIV. Community Affairs Report - Mrs. Sandra Miazza

Mrs. Miazza stated on Saturday, May 17<sup>th</sup> the Senior Citizens Club are having a flea market upstairs in MacQueen Hall and Upland Borough is also having a Clean Up Day. Next Wednesday, May 21<sup>st</sup> is Upland History Awareness Night and it will also be at MacQueen Hall. Mr. Ray Peden will be the guest speaker. He will also have historical artifacts. On June 7<sup>th</sup>, we will have another identification badge sign-up. We're starting earlier this time at 9:00 a.m. because a lot of kids have ball games. The last sign-up we had seventy-one kids. Also, on June 7<sup>th</sup> we're going to have a pre-registration for the Wilmington Blue Rocks game. We're not sure of when we're going. This is more or less to get an general idea. We also have the Memorial Day Parade and a picnic in the park on May 26<sup>th</sup> starting at 11:00 a.m.

#### XV. Use and Occupancy Report - Mrs. Shirley Purcival

Mrs. Purcival stated there were five inspections that passed and there were five units that failed the inspection and two units received a temporary Use and Occupancy Certificate this month. A total of \$710.00 was deposited into the General Fund for U & O Inspections.

XVI. Mayor's Report - Mr. Michael Ciach (Absent due to a family emergency) The report will be read by Vice President, Mrs. Peterson.

Mrs. Peterson stated the following information:

Total Citations for the month : 121 Total of Citation fines - \$6,921.00. Borough's share is \$3,460.50. There were 30 parking tickets issued, 14 motor vehicle accidents and 1 stolen vehicle. The amount received from DJ Court was \$2,653.06. There were a total of 192 calls answered with 8 total assists. We had \$150.00 for tickets paid and 22 parking tickets were sent to District Court. The total count previously was: 423. The current count is 103. The total to date is 526. Also, with regret, I'd like to make a motion to accept the resignation of Steven Bailey and Timothy Garron who have resigned from the Police Department.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Walls. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

#### XVII. Solicitor's Report - Mr. Robert O'Connor

Mr. O'Connor stated the progress on the Verizon Cable Franchise Agreement. Mr. O'Connor stated he examined the borough ordinances regarding the proposed fire resolution.

President Mitchell asked Mr. O'Connor if we could get a copy of your opinion on the fire department.

XVIII. Engineer's Report - Mr. Charles Catania, Sr.

Mr. Catania stated that the Street Resurfacing Bid will be accepted on Friday, June 6<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m.

XIX. Chester Upland School District Report - Mr. Kamp

Mr. Kamp is not present.

XX. Old Business

Mrs. Hicks if we have heard anything from the insurance company on the property down by the ballfield, Mrs. Ladd's?

Borough Manager, Mrs. Purcival stated that she had spoken with the insurance agent that is handling that claim. It is not their position to pinpoint blame. Mr. Catania is working with the company that did the paving. The independent agent has made a recommendation to our insurance company that the first claim be paid and she is aware of that and it is in the system.

Mrs. Hicks asks the time frame.

Mrs. Purcival responds, not really. They will proceed from there.

President Mitchell stated our engineer brings up a valid point that we should send a copy of that.

XXI. New Business

Mrs. Hicks offered a motion, which was seconded by Mrs. Peterson to cancel the 2<sup>nd</sup> council meeting of the month. Council unanimously voted aye on the motion.

Mrs. Purcival stated she has not heard back from the Health Inspector in regard to some training. It is for health inspectors that inspect food establishments. Mr. Kirby and I did speak about this about a month ago, but he was looking into this, but no determination by him has been made as to his attendance.

President Mitchell stated for the record that it is the desire of the new council to have everybody as highly qualified in training. We do want our Board of Health to be certified and certificated through Penn State and some of the other programs and yes, we do pay for that to ensure that the public is getting the right person doing the right job. I think at some point, Council is going to have to set a determination if he is going to do it within thirty days, fine, and if not, then we need to find someone who is willing to do that.

President Mitchell directs Borough Manager, Mrs. Purcival to send Mr. William Kirby a letter to that affect.

Mrs. Purcival acknowledges President Mitchell that a letter will be sent to Mr. Kirby.

President Mitchell announces the June regular meeting scheduled for June 10, 2008 has been changed to June 24, 2008.

President Mitchell continues regarding the Memorial Day Parade attendance. President Mitchell asks Borough Manager, Mrs. Purcival if Council needs to sign up for the parade?

Mrs. Purcival responded that since there are so many new council members, Council members usually form up at Upland Baptist Church parking lot about 8:45 a.m. We have a kick off at 9:00 a.m. Shortly thereafter, we do various presentations at the grave site. Council is more than welcome to attend and you may chose to either ride or walk.

## XXII. Floor Open to the Public

President Mitchell asks that anyone wanting to speak, please come to the podium and address the microphone and state your name and address

Mr. Edward Mace - 403 West 22nd Street

Mr. Mace hands out copies of his complaint to the Borough Council.

Mr. Mace stated he has been a resident of Upland for over thirty years.

Mr. Mace stated he had a petition signed in 1993 from the residents of 21<sup>st</sup> Street and 22<sup>nd</sup> Street requesting the borough put up speed signs and close the private driveway between their homes.

Mr. Mace stated he returned to Borough Council in 1994 and was told it was private property and the borough could not do anything to close the driveway.

Mr. Mace stated he again returned to Borough Council in 1995 and was told no one reads signs, so I said I would do what was necessary to close the private driveway.

Mr. Mace stated he contacted a lawyer along with the residents and had papers drawn up who owned parts of the private driveway. Mr. Mace presents a copy of that agreement.

Mr. Mace stated in 1995 we closed the driveway and certain people, Officials took it upon themselves to open it back up by force which made it a civil matter.

Mr. Mace stated he is here today because I want Upland to close the private driveway since they were the ones that opened it back up. If they had left it closed, today it would have been filled in with dirt, grass seed and a fence would be up, which would have eliminated these problems.

Mr. Mace stated he is giving the Council thirty (30) days to resolve this problem and close the private driveway. He also stated if Council chooses not to, that he will start contacting all the right people to make this happen.

Mr. Mace stated the following reasons why the private driveways adjoined to the two alleys located at 368 West 21<sup>st</sup> Street, 400 West 21<sup>st</sup> Street and 369 West 22<sup>nd</sup> Street and 401 West 22<sup>nd</sup> Street should be closed for good.

1. Drug trafficking and drug use
2. People use it as a shortcut to beat the traffic on Upland Avenue
3. People use it as a shortcut from Edgemont Avenue to beat the traffic to get to Upland Avenue to beat the lights.
4. The following vehicles use the driveway: oil trucks, trash trucks, 35' school buses, UPS and Fedex trucks, tractor trailers that try and fail and rip up our grass, large concrete trucks, all types of delivery trucks and privately owned cars and pickup trucks
5. People park in the driveway and block traffic
6. People have been partying, shooting up drugs, disposing of drug paraphernalia, have orgies and dispose of x-rated materials on our property. They dispose food wrappings and a various assortment of trash.
7. People blare boom boxes and radios while cutting through the driveway keeping the residents from a peaceful and relaxing day and loss of sleep at night.
8. People blocking the driveway and cause traffic jams causing arguments over right of way.
9. Where the alley goes into the highway, street traffic is jammed getting in and out of the alley way causing accidents and fights.
10. Gangs of teenagers use the private driveway for short cuts back and forth from 22<sup>nd</sup> Street and 21<sup>st</sup> Street. They cause gang fights, deface our property, hang around in the darkest areas for illegal activities, harass and torture our pets, threaten residents, urinate, throw stones, break windows and scratch residents vehicles. I don't even want to go there, because if I got a hold of their parents, I'd string them up.
11. Through the years, 4 children have been hit by vehicles, a bicycle, a trash truck and is now suing the City of Chester.
12. My daughter was hit. I've had it!
13. Over 500 near accidents and five car collisions. I'm afraid I'm going to get run over while I'm cutting my grass.
14. Property damage. I just had an incident around 1:30 today from a contractor out in Chester. I called the police.

Mr. Mace stated the trucks are doing so much damage to our driveways, to our yards. They even knock the pictures off the walls in our houses. We have cracks in our walls which we've repaired over fifty times since I've lived there.

Mr. Mace stated the comments made to him is they have a right to be there, it's Chester. Well, it's not Chester! Upland's got to put signs there to keep these trucks out of there.

President Mitchell responds that Council will take this under advisement. There is a couple of things. The alley way is a common way and fortunately or unfortunately by mortar, a lot of the houses on 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> Street are joined together from Chester into Upland. There is really not a break in some of the roads. Osborne Trash coming down, he's got to come out through Upland.

There are a couple of things that you said, Mr. Mace that I would like to address, and we are going to have to look at this as we are a new Council. A lot of the residents are upset in Upland because we haven't done anything. Also, is this in the form of a petition to be filed, "We the People of 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> Street"? I do take the liberty understanding there has been some issues up there and we've had a couple of issues in the other end of town with cop cars being somewhere else and where was our car. A lot of times I look and our car is up in your area in the back alley. But I have to say after looking at some of the reports that have been filed with the county, you can't go out there screaming at people calling them niggers and all of that stuff because a trash truck comes down there. You have to understand that when a police officer is dispatched by 911 to the rear alley, most of the stuff you say is pretty damaging. You kind of provoke everybody. It says right here, you called the trash truck driver a nigger.

Mr. Mace responds that he didn't call him that. I don't use that word. I can get you a hundred blacks to tell you that I don't use that word. I don't think it's right.

President Mitchell responds that he is reading it from the police report.

Mr. Mace responds he has a witness because his sister was right at the window. He may have said "f.u" because he called me a "white mother f'er". I'm not out there fighting with these black people. I don't go around using that word loosely. This guy tried to run me over. He threatened to get out of his truck with his buddy and beat me up. He told me it was Chester.

President Mitchell responds that had you told our officer that I think our officer should have instructed you that if somebody is trying to kill you charges need to be pressed. Our officer can't do that unless you do it.

Mr. Mace responds, I don't like this charges crap. I live in Upland. I don't live in Chester. I have officers telling me we have to see them to do anything. I have a dog that was poisoned. I know who did it. The police know who did it and nothing was done.

President Mitchell stated there is a misconception as to what the police are here for. When I look at this I have six calls within seven hours. You're constantly all the way through here. And in the radio room, they give me a library of phone calls. If that area is that bad, I think we need to do something. That's the first thing. But secondly, we cannot go up because somebody is walking their dog up the street and the dog walks on your grass a little bit in the common area and you start hollering nasty stuff at them. Ninety-percent of what we read here is not very attractive. What you have to do is worry about your property. I understand that I see in the pictures the Borough Trucks up working on something. So apparently we are cognizant there is a problem, but it doesn't require a phone call every ten minutes. We don't have the time or the manpower to come up there for a kid climbing a tree.

Mr. Mace responds that he can understand that but also states when there is a gang of teenagers hanging around there what do you want me to do, not call? Do you want me to duke it out with them?

President Mitchell responds, no. That is definitely a police matter. But when I look at these reports, you're not paying for a full time police officer. You constantly have a police officer there over some things that aren't going on by the time they get there.

Mr. Mace responds that Mr. Mitchell should look at the dates on those reports. They are five or six months apart. It ain't every day. It ain't every week. Sometimes I don't call for eight months. So you've been misinformed.

President Mitchell responds: I can read pretty good.

Mr. Mace responds: I can read pretty good too!

President Mitchell reads the dates of the reports from April and May that Mr. Mace called the police and the number of times he called.

Mr. Mace responds: What address?

President Mitchell responds: 22 over 30 times from the Delaware County Radio Room. I'm not making this up and I'm not here...

Mr. Mace interrupts President Mitchell.

President Mitchell responds to Mr. Mace that if an officer doesn't respond it's because he is somewhere else and if you keep on crying wolf on some of these things, you cannot have a police officer up there twenty-four hours a day. As much as we'd like to have one up there to stop some of these problems. You have a judicial process you can follow. If you know that child is out there wrecking your rosebushes, press charges on the kid. The Upland Police does not see that happening.

Mr. Mace stated that when he went to Judge Miller. Judge Miller said it was up to the police to write a citation to them kids. Judge Miller told me to go to the DA's office. When I went to the DA's office they said they weren't going to prosecute and we're not going to go after the parents either.

President Mitchell responds the Borough Council as a legislative body cannot. We're not going to sit here and pass a law saying "Do not wreck thy neighbors bush."

Mr. Mace responds "That's not the point." These police officers are supposed to write citations. They could have put an end to this a long time ago. I'm more concerned about getting the driveway blocked off.

President Mitchell responds that he's not sure if they can do anything about the traffic because it's a common area.

Mr. Catania stated the deed would have to be checked to see what roads are common.

President Mitchell stated the actual driveway of Chester coming down is a common alley.

President Mitchell asks Mr. Mace if he ever acted on the Agreement submitted to Council by going to court? Was it recorded?

Mr. Mace stated it was recorded and everything is legal.

President Mitchell asks Borough Manager, Mrs. Purcival if the borough has any settlements on file?

Mrs. Purcival stated the Solicitor should check with the Recorder of Deeds.

President Mitchell addresses Mr. Mace and stated we will look into the agreement and if it has merit we'll definitely act on it and we will definitely let you know.

Mr. Mace stated it was closed until Captain Love and Dave Edwards came over there with paint and a dump truck on private property.

Mrs. Purcival stated the driveway was opened because of an issue with fire equipment going in there. I was not aware of the issue.

President Mitchell addressed Mr. Mace and stated the Borough Council will certainly look into this issue. We certainly heard you. I have to tell you at looking at what the county has supplied us, there are just some things you just can't have the police up there every day. Children in your tree are just children in a tree.

President Mitchell continues and stated a Petition submitted "We the People" with no names on it? Mr. Mace supplied us with an agreement which is valid, and we will look into it, but at the same time, we cannot have "nuisance calling". We never know when there is a serious problem when there isn't, and if there is a more serious problem somewhere else, our police car will go there.

Mr. Mace stated, "Of course when there is only one police officer around."

President Mitchell stated, unfortunately, but that's what the budget calls for.

Mr. Mace stated we should have experienced police that know their job and do their job. I know my rights. Them police are there to serve the public to their best ability.

President Mitchell stated that we do not have a police officer there all day.

Mr. Mace stated that residents up there want the police to patrol up there once in awhile, not once every six months or at voting time.

President Mitchell responded: "Not with this Council."

Mr. Mace stated that he sent a letter a few months before the new council was appointed and I had a talk with the Mayor and he had all of these great ideas. I haven't seen anything yet and the people haven't seen anything either.

President Mitchell stated that he has been listening to him for over thirty-five minutes. We're not going to keep this going. You gave us enough information and we will look into it and we'll get back to you. That's the best we can do.

Janice Geraghty - 1016 Church Street

Mrs. Geraghty asked how come nobody has been notified what is going on from the people who are collecting the Earned Income Tax. How come we haven't received anything in the mail? So when should we get this?

Borough Manager, Mrs. Purcival stated the information went to the businesses last week and this week. The information to the residents is due to go out the next week and the following week.

Mrs. Geraghty asked about Upland getting a floating bond to do the renovations at Auburn Village. Is that true?

President Mitchell stated: That's not true. We have not met with bond counsel. We have talked about the need to rehab it. We have petitioned the county to see if we could get funds, but that is not a bond issue. To ease your mind, if we did float a bond issue to rehab your investment, as a taxpayer, those homes over there belong to the Borough and if it wasn't for the rents collected for the last five months, we would have been out of business a long time ago. Because I have said many a time, we were left with \$880.00 to make payroll and everything else we have to do. You have a copy of everything we're paying. If it wasn't for the rents coming in monthly, we would have never made it. The street lights would have been out. The red lights would have been out. No police protection. No trash collection.

Mrs. Geraghty asked: So Auburn Village is self sufficient?

President Mitchell replies: You got that right.

Mrs. Geraghty stated that she heard about the bond and that's why we had to do the one percent tax increase.

President Mitchell responded: Let's say hypothetically if we used a portion of the one percent, to float a bond issue that's not indebting the town. It doesn't require going to the ballot and asking. You're floating a bond issue on free money, not on tax money. I'm not going to raise your taxes or this Council is not going to raise your taxes to float a bond issue to guarantee the payment back from that bond issue. A lot has been said and you've been to almost every meeting that it has been said. Now, we're the first meeting past the last election, three or four weeks ago. President Mitchell continues, "You're not a good republican if you didn't get one mailed to your house, because they mailed it to all of the good republicans."

There being no other business before the Council, President Mitchell requested a motion to adjourn.

Mrs. Hicks offered a motion, which is seconded by Mrs. Miazza to adjourn the meeting at 8:10 p.m. Council unanimously voted to adjourn the meeting.
